Arts and Writing: Harpeth Hall students are regularly recognized for outstanding work in visual arts and writing through the Scholastic Achievement Program. In the 2022-2023 school year, there were 34 Regional Writing Awardees and 26 Regional Art Awardees earning over 90 recognitions between them.

Harpeth Hall develops responsible citizens who have global perspectives and learn to think critically, lead confidently, and live honorably.

#### **Academic Program:**

To receive a Harpeth Hall diploma, a student must complete:

- 4 years of English
- 3 years of math (4 recommended)
- 3 years of science, including biology, chemistry, and physics
- 3 years of social science
- 3 years of world language
- 1 year of fine arts

Harpeth Hall does not rank, but a weighted cumulative GPA including all courses taken at Harpeth Hall except PE/Wellness is provided.

# **Most Advanced Course Offerings:**

In addition to standard college preparatory courses (CP), Harpeth Hall offers Honors and AP courses which receive an additional 0.5 point weight in the cumulative GPA calculation. Other most advanced course offerings include Honors Multivariable Calculus, Honors STEM Research, and Honors Independent Studies in world languages.

#### **Advanced Placement:**

In May 2023, 271 Harpeth Hall students took 658 AP exams. Students earned a 3 or above on 92% of these exams and a 4 or above on 72% of these exams. Winterim:

Started in 1973. Winterim is a three-week term of on- and off-campus experiential learning opportunities during the month of January.

**Global Scholars Program:**
